



By Hand, With Heart ...

traditional hand-knit designs with a modern twist!

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After a 2-hour stint in the Movie Theater



While Binding-Off, laddering one down after 4 sts worked

Movie-time Cowl

a quick mindless knit to work in the round while watching a movie; work the finishing step when you get home! Knit in the round on #15s with 2 strands of bulky held together!



Starting at CO edge, crochet/chain up to Bind-Off edge



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Purl Side with Single "Knit" Stitch



Knit Side with Single "Purl" Stitch

MATERIALS:

- US #15 circls – 24-inch length
- US #K crochet hook
- 137 yds – Bulky Superwash Merino Wool (sample used one skein of Knit Picks Swish Bulky in “Bare”)
- 127 yds – Bulky Superwash + Nylon (sample used one skein of Knit Picks Chromas Twist Bulky in “Carnival”)
- Stitch marker (1 – locking type)
- Tapestry needle to tuck in ends

GAUGE:

- 10sts x 12rnds = 4-inches in stockinette worked in the round, unblocked

FINISHED DIMENSIONS:

- 30-inches x 9-inches

PATTERN NOTES

- This is worked in the round, all knit rounds, for 27 rnds (approx. 9 inches)
- The yarn is held double throughout
- As you bind-off, you will be dropping the 5th stitch all the way down, hooking back up from the reverse to create the knit “rib” on the purl-side
- Note that doing this single “k” along with four purl sts each side, the cowl does not roll on the edges as it did with the all-knit

DIRECTIONS:

- Holding both yarns together, CO 75 sts. Join, being careful not to twist and placing locking stitch marker at the beginning of the round.
- Work 27 rounds of all knit
- Prep to BO by: [BO 3, with 4st on the RH needle, put holder in this single st, ladder down the next st, from the reverse side and using crochet hook, chain back up to the top edge (making sure to use the correct double strand for each round), BO st on hold to chained-up stitch] rep around.
- Pull and push cowl until the “picked up “k” chain are evened out (you can also wet-block to ensure chain is even)

Tuck in all ends andENJOY!
